OUR GUEST SPEAKERS

Paul Kim, M.D. Associate Director of Operations for the Response to Emergencies and Disasters Institute at the George Washington University, a past Director and Area Emergency Manager for the Emergency Management Strategic Healthcare Group where he served as the National Disaster Medical System Coordinator for 3 Upstate New York Federal Coordinating Centers. Dr. Kim has over 20 years of experience in disaster and emergency preparedness. He has been intimately involved in natural disasters to acts of workplace violence and terrorism. Immediately after the September 11th attacks on America, Dr. Kim deployed to the City of New York as part of the Federal Response Plan and served as the Health and Medical Liaison between the City of New York, the State of New York and the Federal Response. He has lectured extensively and is published in academic and professional journals on emergency preparedness, hospital preparedness, public safety and workplace violence. He is the recipient of numerous professional and community awards for accomplishment and service within the public safety and health profession.



John Salka Jr. Mr. Salka is a 25 year veteran of the FDNY and a battalion chief in the Bronx. During his career he has served in many of the busiest units of the FDNY. He has instructed at the FDNY Probationary Firefighters School, Captains Management Program and Chief Officers Command Course. He is a contributing editor for Firehouse Magazine and writes for other magazines such as Fire Engineering and Size-Up. He is the author of the book "First In, Last Out- Leadership Lessons from the New York Fire Department" which was published in 2004. On September 11, 2001 Chief Salka responded to and operated at the World Trade Center disaster and was reassigned to the FDNY Special Operations Battalion to operate at the WTC site for the next several months.



Edward Gabriel The Deputy Commissioner of Preparedness at the New York City Office of Emergency Management (OEM). Mr. Gabriel serves as Commissioner for all Preparedness and Planning related projects and initiatives including New York City's Weapons of Mass Destruction. Mr. Gabriel has been an Emergency Medical Technician

since 1973 working with his Brooklyn, New York based Volunteer Ambulance Corp and is a 27-year paramedic veteran of New York City Fire Department's Emergency Medical Service and has risen through the ranks from EMT to Paramedic through Lieutenant to the level of Assistant Chief/Division Commander. In July of 2000 he was appointed to the title of Deputy Director for Health Issues at the New York City's Mayor's Office of Emergency Management and in April of 2002 was promoted to Deputy Commissioner for Preparedness. Credentialed as a Certified Emergency Manager, Mr. Gabriel currently educates students as Assistant Professor of Public Health at Cornell University, Weill Medical College, Department of Public Health, also training paramedics in the city's hospital and college based paramedic programs. He has authored, in the January 2002 Journal of Neurotrauma, published guidelines, outlining the prehospital management of traumatic brain injury. He has lectured nationally on WMD and Terrorism, also publishing numerous articles on relative subjects.



Paul Maniscalco Paul M. Maniscalco is an Assistant Professor and the Deputy Executive Director of the Response to Emergencies and Disasters Institute with The George Washington University, a Past President of the National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians, Chairman of the NAEMT National EMS Administrators Division and a former Deputy Chief & Paramedic for the City of New York. Chief Maniscalco has over 30 years of Public Safety response, supervisory and management experience. During his tenure he has had the responsibility of responding to and managing a wide array of events ranging from aviation & rapid transit emergencies, natural disasters to civil disturbances and acts of terrorism. Chief Maniscalco has also been engaged in command roles for managing special events such as dignitary visits, national political conventions and a wide variety of mass gatherings. He has also participated in capacity building projects for public safety, emergency and disaster response in India, China, Turkey, Kenya and Tanzania.

Paul has lectured extensively and is widely published in academic & professional journals on Emergency Medical Service, fire service, public safety and national security issues. He is the co-author of the Brady textbook "[The EMS Incident Management System: EMS Operations for Mass Casualty and High Impact Incidents](#)"; a contributing author to the Chemical and Biological Arms Control Institutes "[Hype or Reality? The 'New Terrorism' and Mass Casualty Attacks](#)"; the US Fire Administrations "[Guide to Developing and Managing an Emergency Service Infection Control Program](#)"; National Fire Service Incident Management System Consortiums "[Model Procedures Guide for Emergency Medical Incidents, First Edition](#)"; the co-author "[Understanding Terrorism and Managing the Consequences](#)"; [Mass Casualty and High Impact Incidents: An Operations Management Guide](#); [Terrorism Response: A Field Guide for Law Enforcement and Terrorism Response: Field Guide for Fire and EMS Organizations](#) (Prentice Hall/Brady) and a contributing author to the International Federation of Red Cross / Red Crescent Societies and Johns Hopkins School of Hygiene and Public Health Center for Disaster and Refugee Studies "[Public Health Guide for Emergencies](#)".

Chief Maniscalco is an appointee to the President's Homeland Security Advisory Council - Senior Advisory Committee for Emergency Services, Law Enforcement, and Public Health and Hospitals; a member of the Department of Defense, Defense Science Board (DSB), Transnational Threat Study and the DSB - Homeland Defense - Chemical Weapons Task Force; a member of the DoD/DoJ, Interagency Board (IAB) Medical Sub-Group; an Advisor to the Defense Advanced Research Project Agency ENCOMPASS project; a member of the Board of Advisors for the Oklahoma City National Memorial Institute for the Prevention of Terrorism and an appointee to the Centers for Strategic and International Studies - Homeland Security Task Force. Paul M. Maniscalco also holds appointments to the Congressionally mandated National Panel to Assess Domestic Preparedness (Gilmore Commission) where he also served as the Chair of the Threat Re-Assessment Panel and Chair for the State and Local Response Panel and also an appointment to the Harvard University, John F. Kennedy School of Government and U.S. Department of Justice - Executive Session on Domestic Preparedness.

Paul M. Maniscalco earned his Baccalaureate degree in Public Administration -- Public Health & Safety from the City University of New York, and a Master of Public Administration - Foreign Policy & National Security from the New York University Wagner Graduate School of Public Service. He is presently a Doctoral degree candidate with a research focus on organizational behavior and emergency response to disasters / terrorism incidents.
